FASHION SHOW COMMITTEE – LIONESS JUDY, CHAIRMAN

The Fashion Show committee met to decide how to divide the profits from the recent Fashion Show. Chairman Judy got in touch with Lioness Megan (who is employed by SABVI) to ask her recommendations of where our donations could be best used. The following is the response from Lioness Megan to Lioness Judy: “The Foundation is the fundraising arm, and annually we give more than \$100,000 to the agency so that they may apply it to whatever program is hurting the most. So, if you’d like to go that route then the sponsorship is the way to go, if you’d like to designate the gift, then the Scholarship fund is the way to go. This helps to support the scholarships we give to kids (one even was a graduate of Abe’s Cub House many years ago) to help continue their education. We also provide grants to help create breakthrough opportunities in education and employment for people who are blind, such as supporting a match and science camp for blind kids (who otherwise don’t get the attention they should in those disciplines because of the challenges associated with impaired vision).”

This will help to explain the Scholarship Fund and the Sponsorship donations. The following is where the Fashion Show profits, with the Boards approval, were distributed:

CLOSE WITH A SMILE:
